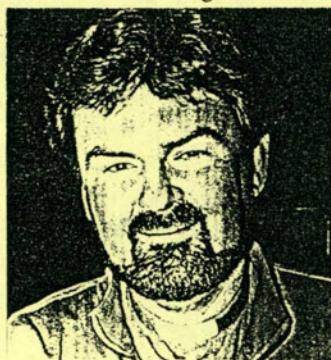



Heatherside Church - the church in the centre

'Do you actually have services there?' is the question often asked. The answer is emphatically 'yes' - every Sunday throughout the year a team of volunteers transforms the main hall or Heatherside Community Centre into a church, and each Sunday more than 150 people gather to worship together. Of course it can still be a little nerve- wracking for visitors, especially if you have children - perhaps you are worried that they might make a noise and disturb others....worry no more! There are lots of children and young people at Heatherside Church already. Every week we have a well equipped creche for babies and toddlers which runs throughout the service (which is relayed to the creche). And on most Sundays for part of the service we have special groups where children enjoy activities, games and teaching appropriate to their age. Heatherside Church **really** is a church for the whole family.

*SAINTS ALIVE CELEBRATION - AN ALTERNATIVE TO HALLOWE'EN

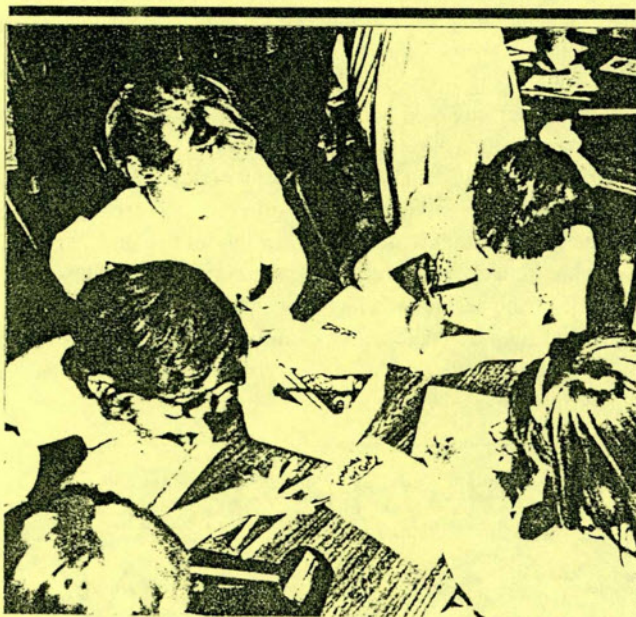
**31st OCTOBER, FROM 6 pm - 8.30 pm
at St Paul's Church, Crawley Ridge.**

Over the past few years there has been increasing concern about the apparently innocent and 'harmless' fun of Hallowe'en. Many parents and some teachers groups are concerned it gives children an unrealistic and naive view of the occult at a time when there is an upsurge of activity and interest in the 'dark arts'.

We continue to read disturbing reports of 'ritual' abuse - 'trick or treat' activities have sometimes lead to criminal damage and may upset and frighten particularly the elderly and very young. Even some who believe that spirits and witches are nonsense are asking why we should cultivate an unhealthy interest in an old pagan festival which celebrates evil.

So is there an alternative? the answer is YES.

On the Saturday evening of 31st October families are invited to "Saints Alive", an 'All Saints' eve celebration taking place at our 'sister' church, St Paul's. There will be games, food and party activities then an all age celebration event with lively music, drama and dance, special guest author and broadcaster, **Adrian Plass**. QUESTIONS WE GET ASKED

WHAT SORT OF SERVICES DO YOU HOLD?

We have two services each Sunday: at 10.30 am and 6.30 pm. These are open to all and there are different services to cater for different needs. At our larger service, at 10.30 am, we have a well-run creche each week for babies and toddlers. 3 out of 4 weeks each month, Junior Church meets for part of the morning with learning activities tailored to the needs of children and young people from 3 to 15. once a month we stay together for a family service, and there is monthly service of Communion, both morning and evening - details of other evening services are given in advance.

HOW CAN WE ARRANGE FOR OUR BABY TO BE BAPTISED?

We hold baptism services (sometimes commonly called 'christenings') on the first Sunday of the month in the 10.30 morning service. Leading up to that are a couple of preparation evenings usually held at Heatherside Church House at 61 Goldney Road. If you want to find out about baptism, either for yourself or your child, talk to the vicar, **John Carter** after a morning service and ask for the special leaflet on baptism, Or phone our administrator **Mary Severn**, on **Camberley 682673**.

MORNING BREAK

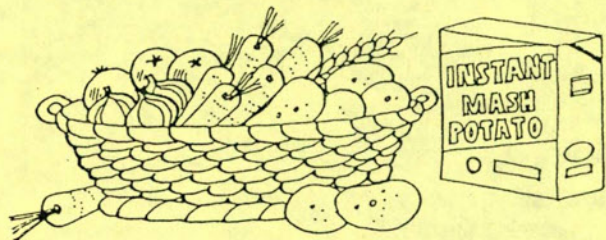
