LOCAL HEATHERSIDE UPDATE

It is a pleasure to be able to contribute to the first edition of *Heatherside NewsLink*. Perhaps 1 can take this opportunity to mention some of the issues which have affected Heatherside recently.

The unexpected floods which hit the Borough in October and January left Heatherside relatively unscathed. The Maultway and the Old Bisley Road were the worst affected areas, with a few unlucky residents suffering bad flooding. At least we now know where the danger points are and hopefully those affected will not have to suffer again to the same extent.

It is very disappointing to report that the proposed trafficcalming measures proposed for Cumberland Road and scheduled for spring 1994 have been cancelled by the County Council. Efforts have been made by Surrey Heath Borough Council to have these measures reinstated, but without success.

There are some other avenues to explore, but these will be timeconsuming. It is so frustrating, especially when we all appreciate how very necessary these measures are!

Following an incident on The Maultway involving a resident of the Ridgewood Centre and two Heatherside residents, Mr. Haughton, the General Manager of Ridgewood, invited the families concerned and myself to a meeting at the centre. It is hoped to hold a public meeting later in the spring to have an exchange of views about general issues of interest. It is good to see this welcome interaction developing between the Ridgewood Centre and the community.

The enormous weight of public concern over the proposed new primary school in front of Tomlinscote school was obvious from the large number of letters sent to the Council over this issue. The decision as to whether to proceed with the school or not was deferred on 7 February (for the second time) to enable an independent in-depth traffic study for the area to be carried out. This shows that public opinion really does carry weight and that people's views will be listened to if they are prepared to express them!

We on the Council must play our part too, by ensuring that our residents know what is happening in our neighbourhoods as far as is possible.

We are all in the business of COMMUNICATION and none more so than our own community newspaper *Heatherside NewsLink*, a brave and imaginative addition to life in our neighbourhood.

CAMBERLEY LIBRARY



Camberley Library was built in 1964 to serve the steadily increasing population of the Camberley area. We now have around 19,000 active library members.

Library members can borrow up to six books for three weeks, free of charge. However, we also offer compact discs, music and spoken word cassettes, and videos for hire. There are language packs and linguaphone courses for those wanting to learn a language, and a new book collection of titles published in the last six months.

Members can also access Surrey's specialist collections through the County Information Centre: the local History library, the Business library and the Performing Arts library.

The County Information Centre can help members find information on a vast range of subjects — from a book on bonsai to local bus times, from a contact for the local education authority, to a tourist video on Hong Kong. There is also a collection of encyclopaediae and directories to which members can refer. If we are unable to help at Camberley, we will suggest another library who can!

The Trailer Library stops at the Recreation Ground in Martindale Road, Heatherside for those unable to journey to Camberley. It is open 10am - 12.30pm, and 1.30 - 7.30pm. Any queries or requests which cannot be dealt with on the trailer will be passed through to Camberley Library.

And if members are unable to visit the library through illness or disability, we can arrange for a volunteer to visit and bring the library to the reader!

HEATHERSIDE MINISTER TO BE MADE DIRECTOR OF LOCAL CHARITY

A new organisation, offering counselling and help to local people, has appointed Rev. Christine Simons of Heatherside as its first full-time director.

'CONNECT' Christian Counselling Service is being launched this Easter with the support of churches, local agencies, doctors and psychiatrists from throughout the area. Based at new headquarters in Sentry House on Frimley Road, Connect will be open to anyone, with or without a church background, to receive professional counselling in complete confidence on any area of personal need.

Christine Simons has been involved in the project since it began more than a year ago: "I'm delighted to have been appointed as director of Connect" she told NewsLink." People have been using the service since a 'pilot scheme' began in November. Pressures from different sources affect many today and our aim is to provide a safe place, through

counselling, where people can be helped to face and handle such issues and gain insights which will allow personal growth and development."

People who seek help may be depressed or anxious, worried about their children or marriage, struggling to come to terms with illness, bereavement or redundancy, facing difficult decisions, or having difficulties in relating to others. Connect has taken on a team of trained and, in many cases, professional counsellors who will be available to help with such problems.

It is just 25 years since a new musical group was formed by a number of people living in and around Camberley, and who had a shared enjoyment in the Operettas of W.S. Gilbert & Arthur Sullivan. As many of these operettas were first performed at London's Savoy Theatre, the group decided to call themselves THE SAVOY SINGERS, and at the beginning of March they put on at Camberley's Civic Hall a celebratory anniversary production of the ever popular "The Pirates of Penzance".

As well as putting on a major Gilbert & Sullivan production during each of the past 25 years, the Society has staged many other one night concerts and also provided the backing chorus to professional artistes such as John Heddle Nash and principals from The English National Opera Company. More recently, the Society has added operettas by Johann Strauss and Jacques Offenbach to its repertoire.

In May this year many of the members will be travelling to Germany to put on a special performance of "The Pirates" in our twinned town of Bietigheim. Then, in September, the Society will be providing entertainment at the National Operatic & Dramatic Association (Southern Area) Weekend School which is held at King Alfred's College, Winchester.





THE SOCCER SKILL **DEVELOPMENT CENTRE**

HEATHLANDS MENTAL HEALTH NHS TRUST THE RIDGEWOOD CENTRE

The Ridgewood Centre provides a base for a range of health care activities. The site is the responsibility of Heathlands Mental Health NHS Trust and houses some direct patient care services as well as the administrative offices of North West Surrey Health Authority and the headquarters of the Trust.

Heathlands NHS Trust provides care for people with mental health problems in Guildford, Waverley, Surrey Heath, Rushmoor and Hart. Common problems treated by the staff of the Trust include depression, anxiety states, alcohol addiction and schizophrenia. People can suffer these difficulties for a number of reasons, a bereavement, divorce, job loss, etc. The Ridgewood Centre provides 49 inpatient beds for local people who are in the acute stages of these illnesses. The unit is fully staffed, 24 hours a day, by registered nurses. Consultant psychiatrists and other disciplines are daily involved in patient care.

People are generally admitted to the unit by referral from their General Practitioner, and the average length of stay is about four to five weeks. The unit offers assessment and diagnosis, occupational therapy, psychological therapies, medication and a range of other specialised treatments.


