I know that the proposals for the redevelopment of Deepcut are of concern to many. No detailed planning application on the Deepcut development has been received yet, however I continue to keep a watchful eye

I will be displaying once again outside the Community Centre a map of those roads on Heatherside to receive Priority 1 for gritting/salt spreading. All our salt/grit bins should be full (report any to me that are not), but note: the salt/grit is for our roads - and not for private driveways!

Despite living in the 'least deprived parish in the country' (it's in the Daily Mirror, so it must be true!), there is occasional anti-social activity and you may have noticed a discrete CCTV camera and improved lighting system on the pathway from Roxburgh Close to Goldney Road. Our excellent PCSO Vince Wakeling drew my attention to incidents taking place down this dark passageway. Similarly, I am funding improved CCTV coverage at Heather Ridge school.

As always I am happy to listen to (and hopefully help) any enquiries or complaints from residents. I am always at the Heatherside Community Centre from 6.30 pm every 3rd Wednesday of the month. Together with our dedicated PCSO Vince, we are happy to discuss any issues you wish to raise.
