Summer, wet or dry, is a splendid and delightfully busy time of year with so many open air events, there is no shortage of low budget or free entertainment once the sun starts getting his hat on and off. The Heatherside funfair proved popular again this year, especially with the very young and young in heart. The Family Fun Day at the Wheatsheaf was also well attended, building on the success of their similar event last year. Heatherside Community Centre hosted a table top sale, which again proved to be popular.

A fairly new children's theatre group, Sense Theatre, founded in 2012, presented a large scale show featuring primary and junior school children from all over the borough. "Living in the City" was performed at the Rhoda McGraw theatre in Woking in June and, by all accounts, a very good time was had by all. Sadly the Arts Council were unable to support this brave new venture due to the cutbacks. Nor can they in their present circumstances offer any grants, although the independent James Winterbottom Bursary Fund is still able to assist professional artistes with training and/or career support. I enjoyed the black comedy "Anna Hersche Must Die" by local playwright Jez Curtis. This was performed by the ever enterprising Playmakers at the Mytchett Centre and the evening was enhanced with a reading by the Young Playmakers from "The Book" by Susan Freke. I was personally privileged to read from a fact based novel, "Innocents into War" by local author Murray Rowlands. This fictionalised and moving account of New Zealand Anzacs at Passchendaele was presented at Camberley theatre with film, slides, readings and narration by the author as part of the well supported Book Festival. Plans are afoot to extend the programme to commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of WW1 next August.

By the time you are reading this the Deepcut development proposals will have been before the council and, hopefully, all issues will have been resolved and questions answered. The decision by the Borough Council licensing committee to allow regulated entertainment in the town square without the need to apply for a separate licence on each occasion is very welcome. One event we can look forward to in consequence is the Camberley Car Show on August 31<sup>st</sup> in aid of the South West Kidney Fund.
